# First Term Exam in Literature:

**Part One:** Read the following text (by H. P Lovecraft) carefully then answer the questions: (10 pts)

- I- -Suggest a title to the text: (1pt)
  - a- Original title: The Terrible Old Man.
  - b- Other possible titles: The Mysterious/Enigmatic Man ...
- II- Define the literary sub-genre under which this text is classified: (1pt)

Short Story (0,5) is one of the three sub-genres of fiction. It is a concise form of prose fiction with a sense of unity. It can be read at one sitting. (0,5)

## III- Identify the basic elements of fiction of this text: (8pts)

- **1-- Theme: (1pt)**
- -- Do not Judge a book by its cover.
- -- Appearances are deceiving.
- -- Underestimation may lead to unexpected results.
  - **2--Setting:** (1pt)

 $a/\underline{Place}$ : The town of Kingsport (0.5)

b/<u>Time</u>: The major event takes place on the night of April 11<sup>th</sup>, but its effects continue to vibrate throughout the spring and summer of the same year. (0.5)

### 3-- Conflict: (0, 5 pt)

<u>External Conflict</u>: Person Vs. Person\_The Old Man Vs. The three Robbers \_\_(They want to rob the hidden fortune of the old man).

### 4-- Characters: (1, 5 pt)

a/ The Terrible Old Man: Protagonist- Major-Round-Dynamic.

b/ The Three Robbers (Angelo Ricci, Joe Czanek and Manuel Silva): Antagonists- Major-Flat-Static.

c/ Kingsport people: Stock.

#### 5-- Point of View/Narrative Perspective: (2 pts)

The story is told from:

- (1pt) a/ A <u>Third-person narrative perspective</u> (0, 5) mostly, for the narrative seems to nurture \* a participating figure who reveals the events about the old man from an objective position without having access to his inner thoughts and feelings using \* the third person pronouns (He/They). <u>Ex</u>: "The inhabitants of Kingsport say .../ He is ...a very strange person".
- (1pt) a/ <u>An Omniscient narrative perspective</u> because: (0, 5) \* the narrative voice is unknown, and \*the narrator uses third person pronoun (**He/They**) to reveal some of the thoughts and feelings of some characters in the story. <u>Ex</u>: "They feared it might be unpleasant ...", "he –Czanek-had expected". (0, 5)

### 6-- Plot: (2pts)

a/ Type: simple because events are ordered chronologically. (0.5)

**b**/ **Structure:** (1, 5 --- 0, 5/ for each step)

- **Rising Action:** three robbers want to steal the old man's treasure after they heard the circulating rumors about it.
  - They design a plan which will not raise suspicion.
- O Climax: When the two robbers stand by the door of the old man after hesitation and knock it.
- Falling Action: As was not expected by the third robber, the old man kills the two robbers who sneaked into his house and moves to kill him mercilessly in his car.

-Despite the news travelling the town, the old man is unshaken.

- 1- The didactic function of literature refers to its ability to pass the wisdom (life lessons) of those who come before us.
- 2- In the exposition, the events are generally introduced to the readers to get a general picture of the narrative.
- 3- Internal conflict happens when a character is pitted against the self.
- 4- A god-like narrative perspective means the narrator knows everything internal related to the characters.
- 5- The novella is one of the three main sub-genres of fiction which holds an intermediary position between the novel and the short story.

# **Part Three:** (5 pts)

- ➤ Having read <u>The Old Man and the Sea</u> in addition to the <u>text</u> above, write a <u>10-line</u> paragraph to answer the question:
  - In what way(s) does the experience of the exam text's protagonist echo that of Santiago?
- Form and language: (1, 5 pt)

Paragraph (Structure, capitalization, indentation, punctuation, spelling, grammatical mistakes, respect of the nber of lines, ...)

Content: (3, 5 pts)

The experience of The Terrible Old man echoes that of Santiago in, at least, two ways:

- 1/ The relation with society:
  - Like Santiago, The Terrible Old Man prefers isolation over interaction with his community despite knowing the resulting rumors.
- 2/ The relation with the self:
  - Like Santiago, The Terrible Old Man's solitude experience, whether in the sea or in his house, endows him with wisdom to manage a life amidst such a society, and therefore:
  - He exhibits a strong sense of resilience and perseverance in the face of adversaries like Santiago.
