Part Two Answer the following questions

(9pts 3pts for each correct answer):

1. In the first two chapters of his novella *Animal Farm*, George Orwell seems to be a proponent of Karl Marx. From one hand, he incorporates the Marxist belief that capitalism is a flawed economic system that relies on labour exploitation and personal profit. On the other hand, he expresses his socialist vision for the future of the society where all individuals are equal and the proletariat are no more slaves. *Animal Farm* is a fable in which the proletariat being represented by animals are invited for a gathering organized by a Boar called old Major to tell of a dream he had seen the previous night. He gave a speech in which he reminded them of Man's cruelty and exploitation referring to him as their true enemy and calling on the animals to overthrow man's rule through rebellion in order to live happily.
2. Suzan Glaspell is a first wave feminist who beckons towards the second wave feminism. While the First wave feminists emphasized the material rights of women (suffrage, contract, education, property...), the second wave feminists insisted on the issues of female experience and language, bodily autonomy, combatting patriarchy, physical and psychological violence against women and marginalization). In *A Jury of Her Peers*, the writer tells the story of Mrs Right who has been imprisoned for murdering her husband. As the story goes on, the reader finds that she is justified in her act because of the marginalization and all the violence that she experienced for 20 years.
3. According to Carl Jung, over the course of one's life certain personality traits that might cause negative feedback and even punishment from the society create anxiety resulting in them being pushed away from awareness into the unconscious where they form the shadow (the dark side of one's personality). The persona is a compromise between the individual and the society as to what a man should appear to be.
