**PART TWO: Definitions (1 pt for each)**

History: The systematic and chronological study of past events based on available sources.

Historiography: The study of how history is written, recorded, interpreted, and transmitted, including the evaluation of sources and authorial perspective.

Interdisciplinarity: An approach that integrates methods and perspectives from multiple disciplines to study complex phenomena.

Research Question: A clearly formulated question that guides the direction, scope, and methodology of a study.

Disciplinarity: Disciplinarity refers to the organization of knowledge within clearly defined academic disciplines, each with its own theories, methods, concepts, and objects of study, and where research is conducted within the boundaries of a single field without integrating approaches from other disciplines.

1. Why did interdisciplinarity become necessary?

Because complex social, cultural, and literary phenomena cannot be fully understood through a single discipline.

2. Role of a research question:
