




Report on Female Students in Bachelor's and Master's Programs

 Report on the Admission and Enrollment of Female Students in Bachelor's and Master's Programs for the Academic Year 2021-2022




Through the chart, we observe that the percentage of registered female students in the Bachelor's program is higher than that of registered male students across various faculties, except for the Faculty of Sciences and Applied Sciences, as well as the Institute of Sports and Physical Techniques. This trend is attributed to male students' preference for such technical and sports disciplines. The following pie chart illustrates that the percentage of registered female students in the Bachelor's program is greater than that of male students.






Regarding the registered Master's students for the academic year 2021-2022, we note that females dominate in half of the faculties, while in the other half, the percentage of registered male students is higher. Upon examining the possible reasons for this, we find that female students tend to prefer literary disciplines, unlike their male counterparts. In terms of the total number of registered Master's students for the academic year 2021-2022, the percentage of females is greater than that of males, as shown in the following pie chart.

We cannot overlook the university as a whole; thus, the total number of students registered for the academic year 2021-2022 consists of 64% females out of the total enrollment.







 Report on the Admission and Enrollment of Female Students in Bachelor's and Master's Programs for the Academic Year 2022-2023

Based on the data presented in the graphs for registered Master's students for the academic year 2022-2023, the percentage of females is greater than that of males, amounting to 62% for females and 38% for males.
