1. No Poverty (SDG 1)

Notably, students can benefit from these bursaries even if they need to repeat an academic year, with suspension occurring only after two consecutive academic failures. This flexible approach demonstrates the university's commitment to helping students overcome financial challenges.

Moreover, the university goes the extra mile to ensure that students from low-income backgrounds have access to vital resources. It offers free food, housing, and transportation services to enhance their academic experiences. The provision of balanced and nutritious meals at university canteens contributes to students' wellbeing, while free accommodation options in residence halls alleviate housing concerns. Additionally, free transportation services, including urban and semi-urban buses, ease students' commute to and from educational centers. These support services address the holistic needs of students from low-income families.

☑ Global Student Inclusivity:

The university extends its inclusivity beyond national borders by welcoming international students, particularly those from low or lower-middle-income countries. This approach reflects the university's commitment to providing equitable access to

education. E Research Income from Industry and Commerce:

The university experienced a steady increase in research income from industry and commerce. In 2022, the total research income amounted to 1,082,409,468, and this figure rose to 1,132,405,211 in 2023. This progress reflects the university's active engagement with industry and commerce, focusing on collaborative research efforts that drive innovation and economic growth.

Research Income by Subject Area:

The distribution of research income across various subject areas illustrates the university's diverse academic expertise:

- In the STEM field (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics), the university received 582,252,730 in 2022, which increased to 612,251,351 in 2023. This growth highlights the university's contributions to cutting-edge research and technological advancements.
- In the field of Medicine, the university received 89,939,518 in 2022, rising slightly to 91,139,687 in 2023, showcasing the institution's ongoing involvement in medical research.
- In Arts & Humanities / Social Sciences, research income totaled 410,217,220 in 2022 and increased to 429,014,173 in 2023, further emphasizing the university's commitment to fostering innovation across a variety of fields.

Human Resources:

The number of employees at the university saw growth from 2,000 in 2022 to 2,100 in 2023. Similarly, the number of academic staff increased from 1,100 in 2022 to 1,150 in 2023.

- In the STEM field, the number of academic staff grew from 500 in 2022 to 550 in 2023.
- In Medicine, the number of academic staff remained steady at 40 in both years.
- In Arts & Humanities / Social Sciences, the number of academic staff remained consistent at 560 for both 2022 and 2023.

These achievements reflect the university's dedication to the goals of SDG 9, including promoting sustainable industrialization, fostering innovation, and building resilient infrastructure. The steady increase in research income, especially in the STEM field, highlights the institution's pivotal role in driving technological advancements and regional economic development. The stability in the creation of university spin-offs and the expansion of academic staff further illustrate the university's commitment to excellence across a diverse range of disciplines.
