Preamble of the Conference:

In 2014, the Financial Times titled one of its few articles about Algeria as "Algeria: A Giant Afraid of Its Shadow," a phrase that perhaps accurately reflects the situation of the Algerian economy. The economy witnessed significant development in its financial position over the past fifteen years, making it one of the most financially abundant economies. However, this improvement has not effectively translated into economic growth rates or solved critical issues related to economic diversification, unemployment, and escalating social challenges.

The severity of the COVID-19 health crisis experienced by Algeria has constituted a source of profound and diverse transformations, with various and comprehensive developments. Its powerful and multiplying impact extended to the core of all pivotal sectors and vital activities. This has resulted in clear and evident strategic shifts affecting all organizations and entities in general, and it has specifically touched upon all academic structures. The matter has become intertwined with genuine and pressing developments, embodying simultaneous pressures. It remains a source of essential inquiries concerning values, strategies, procedures, structuring, as well as various orientations and challenges for public policy.

The intellectual presence of Malik ben Nabi's project in this context is directly linked to his interest in addressing the issue of civilization. His keenness to frame his renaissance project under the title "Problems of Civilization" reflects that his intellectual focus was centered on a problematic concern—understanding how civilizations begin, evolve, decline, and how they can be reclaimed after their decline. Malik ben Nabi's civilizational project, which has remained largely confined to library shelves and hasn't been adequately utilized by the Islamic nation, retains significant relevance in a time marked by economic setbacks in most Islamic societies. It has become entrenched in the chains of civilizational backwardness. Therefore, there is an urgent need today to invest in the various dimensions of this project. This can be achieved by revisiting and studying its different aspects by researchers and translating them into programs and measures that awaken Islamic societies from their civilizational dormancy.

Based on the above proposition, researching the ideas and works of Malik ben Nabi is poised to have a significant impact on the renaissance worldwide, particularly in Algeria. Given Algeria's human and material resources, adopting the economic philosophy of this philosopher could pave the way for an economic renaissance similar to Malaysia's successful model. This could position Algeria among the world's leading economies.



Therefore, The problem statement for the conference is as follows:

What are the contributions made by Malik ben Nabi that formed the foundation for what can be termed an economic takeoff project? And how can Algeria benefit from this project?





Conference Objectives

1. Highlighting the content of Algeria's economic policy during the third millennium and assessing its ability to achieve economic diversification and break away from rentier dependence.
2. Shedding light on ways to enhance opportunities for economic takeoff in Algeria.
3. Reviewing mechanisms for restoring economic balances based on scenarios of the pandemic crisis, whether it continues or ends.
4. Emphasizing the role played by the Renaissance thought of Malik ben Nabi in the development process and his propositions regarding ways for developing countries to catch up with advanced nations.
5. Presenting a forward-looking perspective on the mechanisms and foundations for implementing Malik ben Nabi's ideas in the Algerian context specifically.



Conference Tracks

Based on the problem statement of the conference, its main axes become evident as follows:

Track one: The reality and challenges of economic reforms in Algeria.

Track two: The Algerian economy facing the challenges and prospects of economic takeoff.

Track three: The Algerian economy confronting regional and global challenges.

Track four: The Algerian economy and the challenges of economic security in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Track five: The modern developmental renaissance in the thought of Malik ben Nabi (presentation of international experiences).

Track six: Toward a strategy for the development of the Algerian economy based on the renaissance thought of Malik ben Nabi.



Target groups

The conference attracts various groups and sectors:

- Academics including university professors and doctoral students in universities and research centers at the national level.
- Individuals and institutions active in the field of economic development.
- Entities interested in the thought of Malik ben Nabi.



Participation conditions

The research papers must be original and not published to another scientific journal or submitted in previous conferences ;

- Submissions papers should not be less than 20 pages, including footnotes and appendices, with an APA automatic method of marginalization;
- The search should be compatible with one of the conference's topics, and should meet the recognized scientific methodological requirements;
- The submitted paper should be individual or bilateral only;
- The papers should be written in simplified Arabic size 14 for Arabic and Times New Roman, size 12 for foreign languages;
- The research paper should include an abstract in Arabic and another in English or French;
- Accepted papers will publish in a conference book.
