1. Program Description:

The Master's degree in Clinical Psychology is designed to prepare students intellectually to pursue a PhD in Clinical Psychology, School Psychology, or Work Psychology. For example, a graduate is allowed to take part in a job as a psychologist and psychotherapist. The aim of the training is to help students acquire knowledge and capabilities in the field of psychoanalysis and various personality disorders, and to diagnose psychological problems that humans are exposed to, while inculcating an adaptive and synthesis approach in them.
